## Chaplain's Report...

As we continue to celebrate the glorious Easter season and prepare for the feast of Pentecost, it would be good to stop and reflect on the visit of Pope Benedict XVI to our nation. His words were full of hope for our world without compromising the truth. There are many things that God must be very displeased about. Despite all of the good and heroism that exist in the world, evil still abounds and afflicts the lives of many with much suffering. # Catechism

REFORM

I addressed the Papacy last August, but because of the Pope's recent visit to the United States it seems appropriate to look into who he represents and what he means to us and the Church. He is the successor to St. Peter, the Apostle upon whom Jesus Christ selected to build His Church. He speaks infallibly, which means he cannot be wrong because he is directed by the Holy Spirit, when he speaks on matters of Faith and Doctrine. This means we cannot ignore what he says and do what we think is right. We should all try to read the encyclicals, especially the current ones written by this Pope. It will only help us get to know our Faith better.

Here are a few paragraphs from the Catechism on the Papacy.

**881** The Lord made Simon alone, whom he named Peter, the "rock" of his Church.

He gave him the keys of his Church and instituted him shepherd of the whole flock.<sup>400</sup> "The office of binding and loosing which was given to Peter was also assigned to the college of apostles united to its head."<sup>401</sup> This pastoral office of Peter and the other apostles belongs to the Church's very foundation and is continued by the bishops under the primacy of the Pope.

**882** The *Pope*, Bishop of Rome and Peter's successor, "is the perpetual and visible source and foundation of the unity both of the bishops and of the whole company of the faithful." "For the Roman Pontiff, by reason of his office as Vicar of Christ, and as pastor of the entire Church has full, supreme, and universal power over the whole Church, a power which he can always exercise unhindered."

**883** "The *college or body of bishops* has no authority unless united with the Roman Pontiff, Peter's successor, as its head." As such, this college has "supreme and full authority over the universal Church; but this power cannot be exercised without the agreement of the Roman Pontiff."

**890** The mission of the Magisterium is linked to the definitive nature of the covenant established by God with his people in Christ. It is this Magisterium's task to preserve God's people from deviations and defections and to guarantee them the objective possibility of professing the true faith without error. Thus, the pastoral duty of the Magisterium is aimed at seeing to it that the People of God abides in the truth that liberates. To fulfill this service, Christ endowed the Church's shepherds with the charism of infallibility in matters of faith and morals. The exercise of this charism takes several forms:

**891** "The Roman Pontiff, head of the college of bishops, enjoys this infallibility in virtue of his office, when, as supreme pastor and teacher of all the faithful - who confirms his brethren in the faith he proclaims by a definitive act a doctrine pertaining to faith or morals... The infallibility promised to the Church is also present in the body of bishops when, together with Peter's successor, they exercise the supreme Magisterium," above all in an Ecumenical Council. When the Church through its supreme Magisterium proposes a doctrine "for belief as being divinely revealed, and as the teaching of Christ, the definitions "must be adhered to with the obedience of faith." This infallibility extends as far as the deposit of divine Revelation itself.

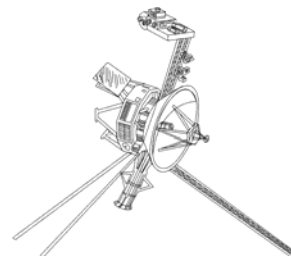

Charles Sevik passed away on Thursday April 10th 2008. He was 75.

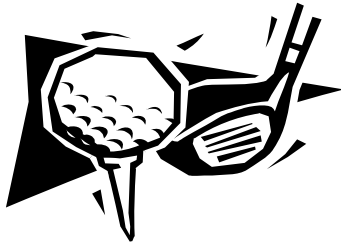
