Catechism

n I've been asked to find some information on the Sacred Heart. The Catechism is lacking
e on any history regarding the beginning of the Its Adoration, so I went to the Catholic
r Encyclopedia where you can find a detailed account of how Adoration to the Sacred Heart
began and how it developed.

A very brief summary. It started in the 11th or 12th century in the monasteries and grew with many Saints being deeply involved in devotion to the Sacred Heart. Sts. Gertrude, Bonaventure and Bernard were only a few involved in the beginning with the devotion that grew to what it is today with many devotions and novenas being held and many Churches and Religious Orders named after the Sacred Heart.

Here are a few paragraphs from the Catholic Catechism regarding the Sacred Heart.

478 Jesus knew and loved us each and all during his life, his agony and his Passion, and gave himself up for each one of us: "The Son of God. . . loved me and gave himself for me." He has loved us all with a human heart. For this reason, the Sacred Heart of Jesus, pierced by our sins and for our salvation, "is quite rightly considered the chief sign and symbol of that. . . love with which the divine Redeemer continually loves the eternal Father and all human beings" without exception.

1439 *The process of conversion and repentance* was described by Jesus in the parable of the prodigal son, the center of which is the merciful father: the fascination of illusory freedom, the abandonment of the father's house; the extreme misery in which the son finds himself after squandering his fortune; his deep humiliation at finding himself obliged to feed swine, and still worse, at wanting to feed on the husks the pigs ate; his reflection on all he has lost; his repentance and decision to declare himself guilty before his father; the journey back; the father's generous welcome; the father's joy - all these are characteristic of the process of conversion. The beautiful robe, the ring, and the festive banquet are symbols of that new life - pure worthy, and joyful - of anyone who returns to God and to the bosom of his family, which is the Church. Only the heart Of Christ Who knows the depths of his Father's love could reveal to us the abyss of his mercy in so simple and beautiful a way.

2669 The prayer of the Church venerates and honors the *Heart of Jesus* just as it invokes his most holy name. It adores the incarnate Word and his Heart which, out of love for men, he allowed to be pierced by our sins. Christian prayer loves to follow *the way of the cross* in the Savior's steps. The stations from the Praetorium to Golgotha and the tomb trace the way of Jesus, who by his holy Cross has redeemed the world
